| <p>Our Sports Coach was able to identify 'non-participants' in extra-curricular sport and provide additional activities and pastoral groups to encourage their participation in sport and physical activity.</p> <p>We continued to work with our in school Dance Tutor and our children were able to experience a wide range of performance opportunities and build their confidence in expression through dance.</p> <p>The Sports Coach focussed on supporting organised games at playtime and within Henry's Club. This was to raise the profile of sport and PE across the school.</p> <p>In school Gymnastics lessons have encouraged key groups of children to explore movement in different ways. The number of children subscribing to Gymnastic, Ballet and Street Dance clubs has increased.</p> <p>Henry Fawcett has worked closely with parents and carers, inviting local health agencies to come to our Parent Forum meetings and other sessions to promote the health and well-being of all pupils, especially those who are overweight or obese.</p> | |

| At Henry Fawcett swimming is delivered through the curriculum in year 3. Pupils are taught in a 30 minute lesson each week. This is so they reach particular attainment targets. A survey taken this academic year showed that 39% of our key stage 2 children continue to swim regularly outside of school. | | | |

Objectives in spending PE and Sports Premium Grant (SPG) 2018-19

Henry Fawcett is never wavering in its commitment to offer an enriching educational experience to its pupils. The timetabled P.E. provision of two hours per week for each class, including specialist teachers is set to improve the offer further.

The PE coordinator and Sports Coach will be looking to enrol in leagues and work more closely with local schools and increase the range of competitive sports. The Sports Coach is continuing his focus on supporting organised games at playtime and within Henry's Club; this will be expanded to the Breakfast Club to continue to raise the profile of sport and PE across the school.

The PE coordinator will be working with the senior leadership team to ensure that the work of teachers and coaches is consistently good to outstanding and evaluate the impact that the premium is having on improving PE and sports provision. This will safeguard the sustainability of the high standards already achieved.

The Department for Education has commissioned the Association for PE to draw up key indicators for the impact of the PE and Sport Premium for schools:

Key indicator 1: The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity

Key indicator 2: The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement

Key indicator 3: Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport

Key indicator 4: Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils

Key indicator 5: Increased participation in competitive sport

Using these indicators, we will monitor and report the impact the school has seen on pupils' PE and sport participation and attainment and how the improvements will be sustainable in the future.



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The broad range of planned support and intervention for 2018-19 includes:

| Provision | Cost | Objective |

| Sports Coach | £8,448.00 | Identify 'non-participants' in extra-curricular sport and provide focused intervention to encourage them to participation in sport and other physical activities. The Sports Coach also has a daily after school club and runs sports in the wrap around care. |
| Dance Tutor | £5,080.00 | Children experience a wide range of performance opportunities. |
| External After School Club Tutors | £4,800.00 | Ballet, Gymnastics and Street Dance provided at a subsidised cost. |
| Competitions & More Able Sports | £300.00 | Through cluster and Local Authority introduce activities specifically aimed at enabling the most able pupils to achieve high standards in PE and sport. |
| Yoga Tutor | £630.00 | Monthly whole class tuition aimed at lower key stage 2 children. |
| Netball Tutor | £480.00 (per term) | Students with an interest in team sports, keen to develop their skills. Aimed at upper key stage 2 children |
| Playground equipment | £1,500.00 | Henry Fawcett is committed to audit and update the outdoor PE and play equipment to ensure engagement and suitability. |
