2015 -16 saw Henry Fawcett staff improve their subject knowledge by working alongside coaches; observing and learning new skills and techniques. The sports coach led the way by joining in with cluster activities and organising inter-school sports competitions. His timetable included a programme to help selected pupils, including the disabled and those who have special educational needs, to overcome barriers and enjoy the benefits of PE and sport. A specialist yoga teacher for children with autism was also engaged to great impact. Through Parent Forum parents and the community were encouraged to increase their children's regular participation in sport and physical activity within and outside school hours. This extended to the community when the school offered it's pitch for afterhours use by the local housing association.

<p>Henry Fawcett is never wavering in its commitment to offer an outstanding educational experience to its pupils. Although the P.E. provision was already of the highest standard with two hours of P.E. per week timetabled for each class and specialist teachers the next round of funding will be spent to improve further.</p> <p>Having honed their PE subject knowledge teachers will now be undertaking lesson study with secondary PE teachers to improve their practice. The dance teacher, sports coach and new P.E. apprentice will continue to teach pupils in PE lessons and to coach sport in new after-school clubs. They will be looking to work more closely with local schools and increase the range of competitive sports.</p> <p>The curriculum team will be working with the senior leadership to ensure that the work of specialist teachers and coaches is consistently good to outstanding and evaluate the impact that the premium is having on improving PE and sports provision. This will safeguard the sustainability of the high standards already achieved.</p>
