Numeracy

Reading Comprehension

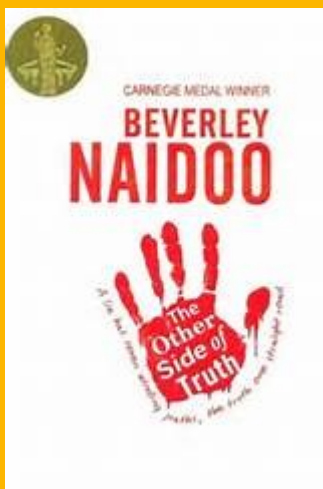
This term we will focus on the skills needed to not only read but also really understand a text.

When the children finish these books and have made the necessary corrections, we have plenty more books for them to work through. 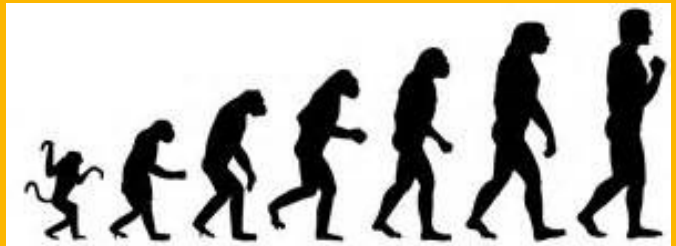

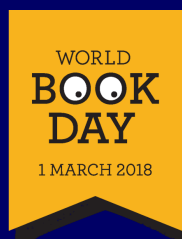
Homework
