Learning for this term

Welcome back! The children seem to have had amazing Christmas breaks and they have come back with lots of exciting stories to share with everyone. This term we will continue to develop our skills in the seven areas of learning with a particular focus on the following:

Personal, Social and Emotional

This term we will be looking at the books 'The Blue Penguin' and 'The Rainbow Fish'. These books look at the idea of friendship and we will explore in class what makes good friends, how we should treat each other and how to begin to resolve small conflicts with our friends.




Numeracy:

In numeracy this term, we will continue to practise our addition and subtraction. We will be finding one more and one less than an amount, using the vocabulary. We will also be exploring weight and ordering 2 and then 3 items by weight.

Literacy:

In Literacy we have begun Phase 3 in our daily phonics and children have begun to learn diagraph sounds (two letters that make one sound). The children have a variety of opportunities to practise applying their sounds, for example writing shopping lists, letters, labelling pictures, speech bubbles, books and many more.




How you can help your child

Literacy

Please continue to read every evening with your child, this will give them a chance to apply their phonic skills and develop their comprehension skills. Children will have their reading books changed in school on Tuesdays and Fridays.

Numeracy

Please practise reading and solving simple addition and subtraction number sentences using real objects. Encourage your child to explain how they have found the answer and each step they took.



Physical Development

Please practise changing clothes and putting on shoes at home with your child, to ensure they are able to change themselves into their PE kits.

To continue to develop their speaking and listening skills, when reading with your child ask questions about what has happened in the story and ask them to predict what they think might happen next and at the end of the story.
